Project Engineering Management (3+0+3 credits, 4 ECTS)

Course Description:

The role of projects in the organization is getting more important as they become the majortool for reaching strategic goals. This module provides an integrative view of project management. Topics include project selection, project organization, budgeting and cost estimation, progress and performance measurement and evaluation, and project auditing. Project planning and control techniques, such as CPM and PERT, are also covered. After project management issues, project planning and control issues such as general review of CPM and PERT models to cover cases with certainty and uncertainty of activity durations; project crashing and PERT/Cost analysis; GANTT charts and resource balancing decisions; control, revision, and verification of projects; computer applications are discussed.

Course Description:

This course aims to introduce the Engineering students to project planning and control. Engineers are responsible for safe, timely, and cost-effective delivery of a broad range of projects in various industries. In this course, the analytical tools and techniques required to manage projects effectively and efficiently will be emphasized. In this module, the project planning and control tools used in managing and delivering projects will be explained in depth. Upon the conclusion of this course, students will have gained practical knowledge of:

- Project management principles
- Project scheduling: models and solution algorithms
- Project monitoring and control tools
- Project risk analysis tools
- Project management software
